Term 3 Week 10

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Term 3 has been a very busy time for the school. The boys have been enjoying excursions to Niangala, Thalgarrah and book week dress up during week 6. The end of the term is fast approaching with only a few days left until the school holidays. We hope everyone has a safe holidays with their families and we look forward to seeing everyone back at school on Monday 10th October.



Birds in our Environment



Over the last three weeks we have been studying birds in our playground and on our morn-

ing walk to the river. Daily the boys have been identifying the birds and charting the numbers and then graphed the results. The boys identified 18 different species of birds: Willy Wagtails, Yellow Rump Thornbill, Magpies, Swallows, Crested Pigeons, Eastern Rosellas, Crimson Rosellas, Fantails, Peewees, Red Browed Finch, Grey Shrike Thrush, Bowerbirds, Silvereyes, Kookaburras, Falcon, Wattlebird, Fairy Wren and White face Heron. There were a couple of species of birds we could not identify. The boys noticed on cold, overcast days there weren't as many birds. The boys researched their favourite bird and did an information report on them. Jet chose the Kookaburra whilst Harley researched a falcon. The boys also completed a chart of interesting facts they have learnt about the birds they have identified. In STEM the boys designed and made their own feeders and hung them around the playground. We were delighted to witness 2 Bowerbirds and a Thrush enjoying peanut butter and seeds on the different feeders. One Wednesday on our way to Walcha Central to do Sport we dropped into the Apsley Falls to chart the birds, we found it extremely hard as it was cold, overcast and about to rain. We could hear plenty of different bird calls but the birds were way up in high trees. We saw some Crimson Rosellas, Thornbills, Magpies, a Crow, Swallow, Currawong and one Robin Red Breast. When we got into town, we did the riverbank walk which was more prolific with bird life. We saw Ducks, Coots, Plovers, Ibis, 2 different types of Cormorants, Swallows, Galahs, Crows, Willy Wagtails, Kookaburras, Magpies, Corellas and a few other birds we could not identify. The boys have really enjoyed the bird unit and now can identify birds in our environment.





During week 8, the boys took part in R U OK Day. This day, in conjunction with Life Education focusses on the idea of checking in with your mates. The boys watched a video which we discussed and then took part in some activities that helped them think about what a good friend looks like (their actions), sounds like (their words) and feels like (how do they make you feel).

Child Protection

This term, the boys learnt about the importance of feeling and being safe through activities and lessons from the Daniel Morcombe Foundation. The focus areas this year were Empathy, Bullying and Internet Basics. In each lesson, the boys watched a video and had to answer a series of questions such as, 'How you feel, what to do and who to tell'. We had some great discussions, especially about being safe online.



Book Week

On Thursday 25th August the boys dressed up for Book Week as their favourite characters. Harley dressed up as Ned Kelly and Jet dressed up as Ben out of Gangster Granny. The boys had a great day and look fabulous in their costumes.

Cultural Day at Niangala School

On the 31st August 2022 Jet, Mrs Wellings and I travelled to Niangala School to enjoy a day of music, art and fun!

During our first session we had 2 people come down from NECOM to help us with our singing skills. We learnt about the 3 positions of A (standing up), B (sitting up straight on the edge of a chair) and C (which was relaxing on a chair). We also learnt how to breathe properly. We sang the 'Hello Song' which was saying hello in different languages, the action song Father Abraham which was really fun, and a song written by Justine Clarke called Thunderbolt's Way- Bail Up! This song was about the bushranger, Captain Thunderbolt. At recess time Niangala, Woolbrook and Yarrowitch kids ate together and then played bullrush on the tennis courts. I enjoyed playing this and catching up with kids from the other schools. It was fun to have lots of kids to play with.
